Many of our clients are young and alone, though we have seen an upswing in clients over 30 year of age. We also have a significant number of new immigrants; from Syria, China, Nepal, Nigeria and other African nations. We have worked with victims of rape and many people in dire financial straits, people with addictions and various health and relationship issues. Regardless of circumstance, each person is valued and treated as family. We see so much good and potential in each one. As much as we give, we gain so much more from developing relationships with these beautiful people, in whom we perceive Christ our Lord.

In 2017 we took in 200 new clients, seen in 1272 appointments. 62 new babies were welcomed at our centre. We have a new staff person, and 12 new support workers were trained in the ministry.
